

## LUYAA Draft Procedures

1. Coaches draft position is determined by a random draw of numbers.
2. Draft proceeds according to draw of numbers and reverses after each round;  
1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10  
10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1  
1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10
3. Coaches should begin draft by selecting through “A” Players (A coach may select any player in lieu of an “A” player. It is however strongly suggested that each team have at least one “A” player).
4. Each coach is entitled to 1-one assistant coach. Coach’s children are considered “protected players” for the purposes of the draft.
5. Players that are not evaluated prior to the draft are assigned a rating by the coaches before the draft. A general consensus by the coaches must be achieved for a player rating to stand. The Coordinator can make the final decision if a consensus for a player’s rating cannot be reached.
6. Once all evaluated players have been drafted, all unevaluated players will be put into a random drawing and selections will be made in accordance with the draft order.
7. A child of a coach is considered to be one of the team’s picks. The round of the pick is determined by the child’s skill classification as a result of the player evaluations.

For example: Coach X has a son, Billy, who is an “A” player. Therefore, Coach X’s first pick in the draft would be Billy. He would not have an independent pick until the second round. If however, Coach X’s assistant coach has a son who was also an “A” player, the team would not have a pick until the third round. If both boys were “B” players, they would serve as the teams first two picks once the “B” players were reached in the draft (after all “A” players had been drafted).

8. Following the draft, all “Yellow Sheets” are distributed to the coaches. Coaches should check their “Yellow Sheets” to be certain that all of their players can practice on the night they have chosen.
9. After the draft is completed, late player additions will be assigned to the next coach in the draft order at the point where the draft was completed. The only deviation to this rule will be the instance where a coach has lost a player (for whatever reason) and needs to add a player to have the same number of players as the other teams.
10. Practice times and locations are selected by the coaches in reverse order of the draft. Coordinators have first choice due to their volunteer commitment. Coordinators should work with coaches to honor work commitments of coaches who need specific practice dates and locations and have the authority to adjust the practice schedule after the selections take place. However, once practices begin, times are not to be adjusted.
11. Trades – Trades are discouraged. No trades can be completed unless authorized by the Coordinator. Trading for talent is not permitted. In only cases of extreme hardship or conflict, can a trade be authorized. If a trade is to be permitted, the Coordinator must insure that a player of equal ability is traded for any player.
