Thank you for your donation to the LUYAA Girls' Softball program. Your donation will be used to replace worn-out equipment and upgrade the condition of the softball fields at Windsor Knolls Middle School (WKMS) and Green Valley Elementary School (GVES). This would not be possible without your generosity; the girls and their families thank you and invite you stop by WKMS or GVES and see your money at work.

The mission of LUYAA's Intramural Girls' Softball program is to provide for the continuing development of softball skills for young female athletes. Although competition increases as girls move up the program, the emphasis is always on having fun, learning teamwork, and increasing skill sets. We strive to accomplish this in a low-key environment at each girl's individual pace. Instructional clinics and materials for pitchers and catchers, position players, batters, and coaches will be a top priority in the future.

The LUYAA Intramural Girls' Softball program has four divisions; ages 8 and under, ages 10 and under, ages 12 and under, and ages 15 and under. Girls pitch in the 10U, 12U, and 15U divisions, while in the 8U division; coaches pitch to the batters. Practices start in March and the season begins in mid April. The regular season ends before the last day of school in Frederick County and we scrimmage other nearby teams through July.

At the 8U level, athletes learn the most basic fundamentals of softball. There is no scorekeeping although making outs while fielding is encouraged. At the 10U level, athletes are introduced the skills expected at the highest level and these skills are honed at the 12U level. Games are umpired and score is kept. At the 15U level, athletes are reinforcing functional skills and learning the nuances of the game. Although still learning a lot, athletes essentially compete at a level consistent with what they will see if they continue playing organized softball, giving them a hint of what they will see at the high school level. Practices are typically about two hours in length, one or two days per week.

I truly believe that sports such as softball teach lessons not found in books, TV, or video games that can be applied throughout life to enhance one's mental and physical wellness.
