Letter from the President

Several years ago, the LUYAA Board of Directors set out to streamline the registration process and implement background checks to help safeguard our players. LUYAA has succeeded in doing both. Registration is now mostly online and extended registration dates have been established to help our families avoid late fees. Walk-In registration at New Market Middle has been shortened to only one day per sport season. Background checks are in full swing and most of our volunteers are familiar with the process by now. Please remember to register for each sport/each season for which you are volunteering. The database recognizes up-to-date background checks and will not re-process them.

LUYAA has had a great winter season and I would like to thank all the volunteers who made that possible. Because of you, the players are able to enjoy each sport and the parents get to enjoy watching and cheering them on.

As we approach the 2008 Fall season, I'd like to thank everyone who has worked so hard to try and improve our field space and availability. I would like to personally thank Sandy Baker for spending countless hours working with Parks and Recreation, and Robyn Stewart for working with our local schools to make sure we have the field space and gym space that our teams need. I would also like to thank our hard-working commissioners for all the time and dedication they put into each sport and having the patience and understanding to share and compromise when field situations arise.

We have had to sort out new regulations from Parks and Recreation this year. This has been a very difficult transition for all of the teams that use those fields. Commissioners need to submit much more paperwork and

LUYAA must follow strict procedures to stay in good standing so we will have the chance to use the fields again next season. We have met with Parks and Recreation to try and ease the burden placed on our commissioners and families. We have made some progress and are hopeful that they will be able to implement some changes in the near future.

As most of you are aware, LUYAA has been working with the Town of New Market to obtain field space, and is in the process of trying to work out the final details. Thanks to everyone who participated in the Town Meeting, further demonstrating the support that LUYAA families have for this project.

I wanted to take a minute and thank our Webmaster, Barb Collins, for all her time and hard work. Barb will be turning over the Webmaster position to our Business Manager, Julie Jarboe.

LUYAA is a volunteer organization and it is only through dedication and commitment of individuals such as these that allows us to grow and support the growth of so many talented young athletes.

Last, but certainly not least, I would like to thank all of our LUYAA families for their continued support of our fundraising programs. Your contributions are very much appreciated and are highlighted by the many valuable programs we are able to offer our children.

LUYAA Refund Policy

All refunds will be directed through the LUYAA webpage, www.luyaa.org. In the event that internet access is unavailable, please contact the registrar.

A \$10 Administrative Fee will be imposed on all refunds requested within 2 weeks of the last registration day at school. (*)

A 50% Refund will be issued for refunds requested before the completion of the second week of practice. (*)

No Refunds will be given after the completion of the second week of practice. (*)

Late Fees and Annual Membership Dues will not be refunded.

(*) Unless a child does not make a select or travel team and no intramural team is available in the same sport, or if the sport is full at the time of payment or cancelled for lack of enrollment.

LUYAA Late Registration Policy

A registration is considered to be 'late' if not turned in at the official LUYAA Registration or if not paid for online by the specified date of on-time registration.

All late fee registrations will be subject to a \$25 late fee. Ten Dollars (\$10) of the late fee will be deposited in the LUYAA Land Fund.

Registration is not complete until full payment is received.

LUYAA Bylaw Article II—Purpose

2.01—To organize and promote athletic and recreational programs on intramural and competitive levels on the basis of good sportsmanship and fair play; these standards are to be observed at all times.

2.02—To offer those programs to all interested youth in the Linganore and Urbana High School districts; any exceptions to be made at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

2.03—To teach youngsters, through participation, the fundamentals and principles of sports.

2.04—To take into consideration, first and foremost, the health, welfare and ability of each individual participant.

Returned Check Policy

Checks that are returned by the bank will be automatically processed electronically. In order to write checks to LUYAA, the following must be agreed to:

If my check is returned unpaid, I authorize my account to be debited electronically for both the check amount and the return check fees.

3 Ways to Register:

1. Pay Online

- Visit our website at www.luyaa.org and click on the link for 'Online Registration'.
- You will be taken to the provider's website where you can register for sports.
- Please register your children starting with the oldest and ending with the youngest.
- Please complete all the fields on the form.
- Click on the link for 'Help' if you have any problems.

2. Pre-Enroll Online & Pay at Registration at NMMS (Express Line)

- Follow the instructions for Online Registration above.
 - Select payment type 'Bring To Registration'.
 - Print an extra copy of your receipt and bring it to the school during walk-in registration.
 - Turn in your receipt along with payment of Cash or Check.
- *If you sign up online and select the 'Bring To Registration' option, but do not come to the school, your registration will not be completed until payment is received, and possibly an addition of late fees.**

3. Register In-Person

- Check the registration dates on the front of the newsletter and on our website. Updates on cancelled or postponed registrations will be posted as soon as possible. Someone for each sport should be there and often give out information for the upcoming sport, and may have other information for you.
- At registration, you must fill out a separate form for each child and for each sport. If you have a question about a particular sport, go to their table before getting in the registration line. Do not complete your check until you are told the total that you owe.
- Please try to sign up all your children at one time so proper sibling discounts may be applied.

COACHES MUST SIGN UP ONLINE ALSO!!

All LUYAA Coaches, Assistant Coaches, Coordinators, Team Moms, Concessions Coordinators, and Fund-raising Coordinators must pass a criminal background check. If you are planning on volunteering for one of these positions, please register early, as the paperwork takes time.

1. Visit www.luyaa.org and click on 'Online Registration'.
 2. Click on Important Info for Coaches and follow step number 2.
 3. If you have had a background check done in the last 3 years, then all you have to do is register. If you haven't had a background check don't, you will need to download the signature form and sign it.
 4. Instructions for submitting it by mail or fax are on the form.

Background Checks

All head coaches, assistant coaches, coordinators, concessions coordinators, and fundraising coordinators and team moms must have a Criminal Background Check approved, and must be approved by the commissioner before any practices may begin.

LUYAA Background Search Criteria

1. Individuals found to be guilty at **any** time of the following crimes will not be accepted for any position within the LUYAA organization. Guilty means the individual was found guilty following a trial, entered a guilty plea, entered a no contest plea accompanied by the court's finding of guilt, regardless of whether there was an adjudication of guilt (conviction) or withholding of guilt. The policy does not apply of criminal charges resulting in acquittal or dismissal.
 - A. Any crimes against children
 - B. Any felony conviction involving violence
 - C. Any sexual offence
 - D. Any felony theft.

2. Individuals found to be guilty of the following crimes with the past **5** years immediately preceding his/her application will not be accepted.
 - A. More than one criminal offense that is drug or alcohol related, or more than one driving while under the influence (DWI) conviction.
 - B. Misdemeanor possession of a controlled substance or drug paraphernalia.
 - C. Misdemeanor possession of a concealed weapon.
 - D. Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a minor.
 - E. Petit theft.
 - F. Misdemeanor domestic violence.
 - G. Multiple crimes.

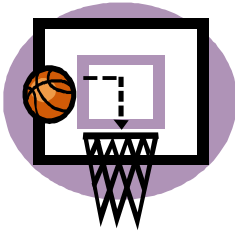

Golf—

The spring 2008 Golf Program will meet from the beginning of April to June one afternoon. Both sessions will be held at the Rattlewood Golf Course.



EQUIPMENT—Your son or daughter will need his or her own equipment. At a minimum that should include a metal, wood (driver or fairway), mid-iron (5, 6, or 7 iron), wedge, putter, and bag. Most starter sets include these clubs. Starter sets vary in price, but reasonably inexpensive sets can be purchased at general sporting goods stores like Sports Authority or Dick's. In addition, the Rattlewood pros can help you fit your child for clubs and will order them for you. Sneakers are fine and golf shoes with plastic cleats are also ok.

The weather is likely to be quite variable in April and May, so be sure your child has a jacket and hat/visor. You may want to consider getting your child a golf glove as we will be spending significant time practicing the full swing, but it is not mandatory. Your child should have some tees and a few golf balls at first.

Lacrosse is fielding another successful season in 2008!



This year we have about 385 players on 21 teams with 63 coaches. That is an average ratio of 6 players to every coach, which provides exceptional opportunities for learning. Most of our coaches have completed multiple clinics in coaches training, and many are US Lacrosse Certified. Additionally, for the first time this year, we required that every team have at least one

coach trained with the Positive Coaching Alliance (www.positivecoach.org). This exemplifies our commitment to teaching not only the game of lacrosse, but also the life long lessons that come with organized, team sports. I am happy to report we had 100% compliance with this requirement.

Our program is not only growing in numbers, but growing with opportunities as well. Girls continue to participate in the Western Maryland Youth Lacrosse Conference (www.wmylc.com), and play against teams from Frederick and Washington Counties, as well as Chambersburg, Pennsylvania. For those of you who are registering for Fall 2008 Competitive Soccer, which is to say, all soccer which is U10 and older, if your child did not play Competitive U10 or older soccer this past Spring of 2008, then you must order the new Adidas uniform kit. The kit consists of a jersey, shorts and socks. If your child already played U10 or older this past Spring of 2008, then you've already ordered the kit and will not need to re-order an entire kit. If you already ordered a Spring 2008 uniform and your child played in that uniform this past Spring, but your child has grown and you need larger sizes, you may order replacement parts during the registration process if you need to, one piece at a time.

One more note about the uniforms: If your child made a LUYAA SC team, then your uniform ordering process is done separately through your team.

Softball—

Over 250 girls are set to play the great sport of softball in the LUYAA program. This spring, the LUYAA intramural program will have four teams in the 8 and under division (8U) and five teams in 10U and 12U. And for the first time in a long time, LUYAA will have a complete travel program with four 15U teams, a 12U and a 10U team all vying for Frederick County Girls Softball League titles.
