Letter from the President

LUYAA Families,

Thanks to you, our organization has been growing every year. As a result of this continued growth, we find ourselves in greater need for fields. LUYAA has been diligent in looking to obtain more fields and with the help of Mayor Burhans and the current Town counsel, we have been able to attain land to build a park in New Market. Thank you, Mayor Burhans for understanding how important these fields are to our young athletes and for your assistance in securing a place for them to play. The County process has been long, but we are getting closer to being able to start grading the property. If you know of any LUYAA members or friends who might be able to donate time and equipment, please let us know.

Parents, I can not stress enough the importance of your feedback to the Commissioners about coaches and to the Board of Directors about Commissioners. LUYAA tries very hard to select coaches and Commissioners who are qualified and who care about the sports and the children. Without your feedback, we do not know when we need to assess the performance of a coach or Commissioner and implement necessary changes. It has been suggested that LUYAA setup a feedback site so parents feel comfortable providing feedback on a coach or Commissioner. The Board is looking into this suggestion and will hopefully be in a position to implement something in the near future. In the mean time, if you have a situation you need to make a Commissioner or the Board aware of, please email me at President@LUYAA.org. Your comments and feedback will remain anonymous unless you request otherwise.

LUYAA has Registration in April and we have had to increase our family fee from \$15.00 to \$20.00. LUYAA has not increased this fee for several years and unfortunately, the cost of doing business has steadily increased and so must our family fee. We are slowing stepping the fee up and it will settle in at \$25.00 for next year. We realize the impact this might have on some of our family's so we

are trying to raise it a little at a time.

Many commissioners have been receiving questions about what is going to happen once Lingapore High School re-opens and Oakdale High School is opened as Oakdale. The LUYAA Board has been discussing this for a while and will have a decision shortly. I would like to assure everyone that children living in the Oakdale High School area will remain part of the LUYAA Organization. Will the LUYAA name change? That is one of the questions the Board of Directors is discussing and we will let everyone know well before the switch is made. No matter the outcome, the children living in the Oakdale area are, as always, an important part of our LUYAA Family.

3 Ways to Register:

1. Pay Online

- You will be taken to the provider's website where you can register for sports.
- Please register your children starting with the oldest and ending with the youngest.
- Please complete all the fields on the form.
- Click on the link for 'Help' if you have any problems.

2. Pre-Enroll Online & Pay at Registration at NMMS (Express Line)

- Follow the instructions for Online Registration above.
 - Select payment type 'Bring To Registration'.
 - Print an extra copy of your receipt and bring it to the school during walk-in registration.
 - Turn in your receipt along with payment of Cash or Check.
- *If you sign up online and select the 'Bring To Registration' option, but do not come to the school, your registration will not be completed until payment is received, and possibly an addition of late fees.**

3. Register In-Person

- Check the registration dates on the front of the newsletter and on our website. Updates on cancelled or postponed registrations will be posted as soon as possible. Someone for each sport should be there and often give out information for the upcoming sport, and may have other information for you.
- At registration, you must fill out a separate form for each child and for each sport. If you have a question about a particular sport, go to their table before getting in the registration line. Do not complete your check until you are told the total that you owe.
- Please try to sign up all your children at one time so proper sibling discounts may be applied.

FOOTBALL:

Wow! I can't believe it is that time already. This year, as promised, you will see a few improvements in our cheerleading program. You will notice some new uniforms on the field, as well as a set of poms for every team (yes...no more sharing!!), and we are taking a step up with matching warm-up's for the girls!

Registration: Online registration will start May 4th; walk-in registration will be one day only, May 9th from 10am-12pm. This year we will be accepting any children (boys are welcome too!) that are entering grades 1st-8th, no exceptions. Please remember registration is based on sign ups, so make sure you sign up early to ensure your cheer spot!

We will try to have the girls placed on squads based by grades they are entering into, like last year. There may be the chance that we need to move girls around due to balancing squad sizes; we will do that based upon ages and/or cheer experience with LUYAA. Requests for placements will NOT be honored. Fees: We are keeping our fee at \$65, which will be due the day that you register. A mandatory Accessories fee of \$50 will be due to your coaches by the first week of practice (this will go towards bows, warm-up jacket, warm-up pants, and cheer socks).

Uniforms: We will issue out uniforms within the first two weeks of practice. As in the past, you will need to provide an undated check for \$100 made payable to LUYAA. The checks will be held and not cashed, unless of course the uniform is damaged, altered, or not returned. Before a uniform is issued we will need to collect a valid Maryland ID card of the cheerleader. These are not LUYAA's rules; they are the MMYFCL rules (the league we cheer within). You will get the cards back at the end of the season.

You will also need to have bloomers, a crop top body suit, and cheer shoes. Your coaches will contact you with further information on ordering these items. If your items are in good condition from last year, feel free to use those! ***If they are in good condition, but they no longer fit, please bring them to our walk in registration.***

We would like to "recycle" these items within our program.
