LUYAA Bylaw Article II—Purpose

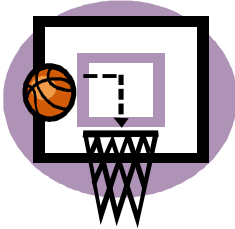

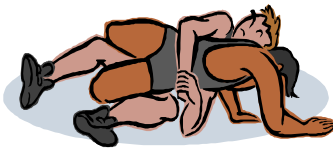

Wrestling

We had another tremendous year in the LUYAA wrestling program. Our squad this year comprised 79 wrestlers ranging in age from 4 to 14 years old.



Highlights

Prior to the start of the season in early January, the wrestlers participated in several team and individual tournaments in the month of December. These are not mandatory to attend, but nearly every wrestler attended at least one of the events.



The more experienced Predators wrestled in the Cougar Challenge on Dec 6th, placed 3rd in the Tuscarora tournament on Dec 12th, then wrestled the next day in the Outlaw Duals on Dec 13th and finished 3rd out of 8 teams. This was a highly competitive tournament and the Predators defeated two very good teams from Howard County to earn 3rd – the Vipers and the Warhawks.

We had (27) and (22) of our novice wrestlers compete in the Matbash and PAL tournaments in December as well.

The Predators placed (9) wrestlers in the Maryland State Tournament on Feb 27th and 28th. To place, a wrestler must finish in the top 6 in their respective weight and age bracket.

We also just finished wrestling in the Mason Dixon League (MDL) Championships on March 14th and placed (25) wrestlers in the top 4 of their respective weight and age brackets. As a team, the Predators placed 3rd out of 20 teams.

In order to qualify for the MDL Championships, the wrestlers first had to place in the top 4 within their division at the MDL Division B Qualifier held on March 7th. The Predators qualified an amazing (44) wrestlers and finished 2nd out of 10 teams in this event.

MDL

The MDL consists of 20 teams located in 4 states; Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Virginia, and Maryland. The season runs approximately from November 16th through mid-March including the Mason Dixon League Championships.

The weight classes in this league are age and weight dependent; Bantam (up to 7), Midget (8-9), Junior (10-11), Intermediate (12-14). The matches are generally held on Sundays but occasionally are held on Saturdays. Age is determined as of December 31st. We occasionally allow 4 and 5 year olds to wrestle but the fathers must sign up to help coach.

This Summer

We will be holding “Open Mats” throughout the summer once a week (day and time TBD) and will continue to do so until practice begins in mid-November. “Open Mat” means the practices are not mandatory, so just show up when you can. We also open it up to all wrestlers - experienced and beginners (everyone is welcome). We even have kids showing up who never wrestled before so they can give it a try and see if they like it. We have had tremendous turnouts for these Open Mats in the past as the enthusiasm level for wrestling in Frederick County continues to grow.

For those wrestlers who are beginners to the sport, I keep a *shoe and headgear bank*. Experienced wrestlers turn over to me every year head gear and shoes that no longer fit and I provide them to beginners at no cost. I will make these available to the kids throughout the summer at the Open Mats.

Camps

25 of our advanced wrestlers were fortunate enough this past year to attend the Eaglehawk Academy

every Tuesday night in Bethesda for 12 weeks under the supervision of Wade Schalles. For those not familiar with the name, Wade is one of the greatest wrestlers of all time and a tremendous teacher of the sport. This was a tremendous opportunity for our kids and coaches alike. We are looking to do something similar next year.

The success of this past year prompted us to set up a wrestling camp this summer with Wade at Urbana High School. The camp will run from Monday, July 19th through Thursday, July 22nd. There will be different sessions during the day to accommodate beginners to advanced wrestlers.

Coaching

If you have wrestling experience I would like to have you for an assistant coach and encourage you to contact me any time before registration starts this fall. You will be required to have a background check through the LUYAA organization. Please register on the LUYAA website at www.LUYAA.org The assistant coaches help the wrestlers through moves and

drills. If you sign up as an assistant coach, please be prepared to be at every practice. We strive for a ratio of 1 coach to every 4 wrestlers. Please email me if you are interested in being an assistant coach.
