LUYAA Refund Policy

All refunds will be directed through the LUYAA webpage, www.luyaa.org. In the event that internet access is unavailable, please contact the registrar.

A \$10 Administrative Fee will be imposed on all refunds requested within 2 weeks of the end of on-time registration. (*)

A 50% Refund will be issued for refunds requested before the completion of the second week of practice. (*)

No Refunds will be given after the completion of the second week of practice. (*)

Late Fees and Annual Membership Dues will not be refunded.

(*) Unless a child does not make a select or travel team and no intramural team is available in the same sport, or if the sport is full at the time of payment or cancelled for lack of enrollment.

LUYAA Late Registration Policy

A registration is considered to be 'late' if not paid for online by the specified date of on-time registration, or if the registrar is not contacted by those having difficulty registering.

All late fee registrations will be subject to a \$25 late fee. Ten Dollars (\$10) of the late fee will be deposited in the LUYAA Land Fund.

Registration is not complete until full payment is received.

LUYAA Bylaw Article II—Purpose

2.01—To organize and promote athletic and recreational programs on intramural and competitive levels on the basis of good sportsmanship and fair play; these standards are to be observed at all times.

2.02—To offer those programs to all interested youth in the Linganore and Urbana High School districts; any exceptions to be made at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

2.03—To provide an opportunity for our children to learn the fundamentals of their respective sports and under competent leadership, to enjoy participation and competition in organized leagues so that they may become better persons. To develop positive social values and character traits, good citizenship, physical and mental health, and a knowledge, appreciation and interest in sports. It is the goal of LUYAA to instill the will to win and the courage to accept defeat, with emphasis on clean play, safety and sportsmanlike conduct.

2.04—To take into consideration, first and foremost, the health, welfare and ability of each individual participant.

Financial Disclosure Policy

LUYAA members in good standing who wish to obtain financial information must do so in writing in advance. Requests can be made via e-mail to treasurer@luyaa.org or by US mail. The treasurer has the right to deny requests that would require the release of confidential information or be deemed unreasonable. Appeals should be directed to the LUYAA President. The financial statement will be provided within 30 days.

Soccer

Before we get into the fall season, a quick look back to the spring season to thank those who helped out in so many ways. Our LUYAA Soccer Community contributed a great deal to the success of the Stop the Violence Futsal Tournament which benefited the Tobin Triebel Trust. LUYAA Soccer families donated concessions and money to the cause. LUYAA Soccer's Jim Oman coordinated the Futsal Tournament at Oakdale High and the weekend was a complete success. Later in the spring Jim also coordinated our first LUYAA Soccer 5 Aside Challenge. Over 70 teams participated and several families donated time and effort to the success of the tournament. Jim will be coordinating additional tournaments for us each season as LUYAA Soccer continues to grow. Our Melanie Robinson helped to coordinate these activities as well and also rounded up donations for the local food bank and also the kickback program, which encourages families to donate their old soccer gear for the benefit of those in need. We collected a great many items for all of these causes and I'd like to



extend a big Thank You to all of you who donated to these efforts. The Fall Soccer season is underway with about 700 children playing LUYAA Soccer, ranging in age from pre school to high school. I'd like to remind all of our soccer families about the official LUYAA Chain of Command. That policy states that if you have a concern, you need to first address that concern with your immediate head coach. If you do not receive satisfaction, from there you go to the coordinator of that coach, then to the sport commissioner, then to the LUYAA Board of Directors. If you bypass steps in the Chain of Command, you will be redirected to the step skipped, so please follow the official Chain of Command for maximum efficiency. All coordinators for LUYAA Soccer are listed on the contacts page for soccer at www.luyaa.org/soccer.htm Our Tots program for 3s and 4s is coordinated by Melanie Robinson. Tots is an introductory age for our participants and each child gets a ball to keep, a t-shirt and soccer socks. We do not play competitive team versus team games at this age. Tots focuses on activities with a ball and each child focuses on their own ball in those activities. Our U 6 program is for five year olds and rising Tots who will be 5 during the soccer season. Melanie Robinson also coordinates U 6 and each child receives a ball to keep, a t-shirt and soccer socks. U 6 teams compete in a 3 player versus 3 player format, but scores and standings are not kept. At U 8 our LUYAA Soccer players are introduced to competition against players from other areas in our Double Nickel League. A small amount of travel is involved for our first and second graders who participate in the DNL. The U 8 players compete in a 5 player versus 5 player format, but again, scores and standings are not kept. Our U 8 Coordinators are Paul Riley and Jim Oman. They are succeeding Tom Troutman who had coordinated U 8 for four years. Above the age of U 8 we have both a

recreational level (Frederick County Youth Soccer League) and a competitive level, LUYAA SC. Both of these are run by LUYAA Soccer and are a part of LUYAA. Most of the children who play on our competitive "SC" teams began with LUYAA recreational teams and played in FCYSL. It is a natural progression for the child who wishes to play soccer at a more competitive level. This season for the first time, we will have more competitive level teams in LUYAA Soccer, than recreational level teams. Our competitive level teams participate in various leagues, including the Washington Area Girls Soccer League (WAGS), Montgomery Soccer Inc., (MSI) and the Central Maryland Small Sided League (CMSL).

John Cunha coordinates these teams and you can contact him for more information. The LUYAA Soccer store is also located there and you can purchase items directly on line.

The LUYAA Soccer Golf Tournament will take place at Worthington Manor on Monday, October 5 at 10 AM. It is a scramble with a shotgun start. Golfers, sponsors and volunteers are always needed. Wrestling—

Wrestling Starts Monday, November 16th

We are looking forward to another tremendous year in the LUYAA wrestling program. We have been holding "Open Mats" throughout the summer on Monday evenings from 6pm-7:30pm at Gold's Gym and will continue to do so until practice begins in mid-November. "Open Mat" means the practices are not mandatory, so just show up when you can. We also open it up to all wrestlers - experienced and beginners (everyone is welcome). We even have kids showing up who never wrestled before so they can give it a try and see if they like it. We have had tremendous turnouts for these Open Mats as the enthusiasm level for wrestling in Frederick County continues to grow.

Leagues

LUYAA will wrestle in two leagues this year similar to the previous two years; the Mason Dixon League (MDL), and the Capital Area Wrestling League (CAWL). The beginners and less experienced wrestlers will wrestle in the MDL while the more experienced wrestlers will wrestle in both leagues.

MDL

The MDL consists of 18 teams located in 3 states; Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and Maryland. The season will run approximately from November 16th through mid-March including the Mason Dixon League Championships. The weight classes in this league are age and weight dependent; Bantam (up to 7), Midget (8-9), Junior (10-11), Intermediate (12-14). The matches are generally held on Saturdays but occasionally are held on Sundays. Wrestlers must be between the ages of 6 and 14. Age is determined as of December 31, 2009. We occasionally allow 4 and 5 year olds to wrestle but the fathers must sign up to help coach. We try to get at least 2 and no more than 5 matches for each wrestler at every weekend meet. We usually will start MDL matches the first weekend after

the New Year and finish with the League Tournament the first or second weekend in March.

CAWL

This league will be for experienced wrestlers only and typically consists of 6th-8th graders, except for the lower 4 or 5 weight classes. The CAWL matches are a dual format. This is the same as High School wrestling where each wrestler earns team points and you win or lose as a team.

Practice Locations

Practice locations will be at Oakdale HS, Urbana HS, and Gold's Gym (5728-B Buckeystown Pike, Frederick in the Evergreen Shopping Center on Route 85 behind Longhorn Steak House).

Practices typically run 2 hours, generally from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM. We typically break the kids into 4 squads and place them based on experience level, age, and weight. Most squads will practice twice a week while the more experienced squads will practice more.

Fees

We are raising the rates to \$165 per wrestler this year, up from the normal \$90 per wrestler in previous years. We are striving to make this an "all encompassing fee" as trying to collect money for warm-ups and tournaments as well as do fund raising during the season becomes very burdensome. In years past, we have collected these fees during the season so the additional \$75 you are paying we would eventually collect anyway.

For those wrestlers who are beginners to the sport, I keep a **shoe and head-gear bank**. Experienced wrestlers turn over to me every year head gear and shoes that no longer fit and I provide them to beginners at no cost. So before you run out and buy all new stuff, please check with me at the first parents meeting.

We had to purchase all new uniforms last year, but our fund raising efforts this year are focused on purchasing two new state of the art wrestling mats and a trailer to store them in.

As any father or coach who has been in the program for several years will attest, hauling mats from location to location on the day of an event takes about 10 people and is not easy work as each section weighs several hundred pounds. These new mats can be easily handled with only two people and stored in a trailer for use in wrestling meets only – meaning we will not have to use our practice mats anymore!!! Down the road, we are hoping to get a permanent wrestling facility that we can use as we please 12 months a year. A facility about 6,000 square feet would be ideal.

Coaching

If you have wrestling experience I would like to have you for an assistant coach and encourage you to sign up as an assistant coach at registration. You will be required to have a background check through the LUYAA organization. Please register on the LUYAA website at www.LUYAA.org The assistant coaches help the wrestlers through moves and drills. If you sign up as an assistant coach, please be prepared to be at every practice. We strive for a ratio of 1 coach to every 4 wrestlers. Please email me at dma-kosy@southlandind.com if you are interested in being an assistant coach.
